COVID-Safe Check-In

COVID Safe Check-In is a new feature that has been added to the free [mySA GOV app](#).

You can download the mySA GOV app using your smart phone. In the mySA GOV app, select the COVID Safe Check-In tile when you arrive at a venue or business, and follow the prompts to scan their unique QR code and check in.

You are not required to login or sign up for a mySA GOV account to use the COVID Safe Check-In. You also do not need to provide a driver's licence or vehicle registration details to use it.

Regional Event Fund

The Marshall Liberal Government is putting regional jobs first, thanks to an additional \$1 million in regional event funding – set to spur new and innovative events and to grow existing events right across the state.

Through the South Australian Tourism Commission, the State Government is committing an additional \$1 million to South Australia's regional events in 2021/22 to strengthen the regional events calendar by encouraging the development of new and innovative regional events, grow existing events, and drive increased visitation and economic stimulus to the regional economy. Applications for Significant Event Funding will be accepted year-round, funding available from 1 July 2021.

Applicants can seek funding grants from \$5,000 to more than \$50,000 (excluding GST).

Applications for Round 1 closes at 5:00pm on Monday, 12 April 2021.

Biosecurity Business Grants Program

The Biosecurity Business Grants program will run over 3 years from 2020-21 to 2022-23 and will be delivered through the Indigenous Rangers Biosecurity Program. \$880,000 (GST inclusive) is available per funding round (i.e. for each year).

Grants will be available to existing or new Indigenous businesses (or other organisations working closely with Indigenous communities) to develop business, feasibility or marketing plans and/or to fund innovative business opportunities that capitalise on biosecurity.

Grant activities must relate to biosecurity activities, including:

- surveillance
- preparedness
- risk management
- capability building

Volunteer Grants - Expressions of Interest Open

The 2021 Volunteer Grants round begins with a call for Expressions of Interest, with your local Federal Member of Parliament (MP) using a community committee to develop a list of organisations to nominate. Following the Expression of Interest process, the MPs will nominate organisations from their lists.

Grants of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 are available to help community organisations and support the efforts of volunteers. The grants can be used to buy small equipment for volunteers or reimburse volunteer fuel, transport, or training costs - organisations must have an ABN to be eligible to apply.

The nomination period is between 6 April 2021 and 2:00pm AEST 29 April 2021.

Boosting Female Founders Initiative – Round 2

The Boosting Female Founders Initiative - Round 2 helps female entrepreneurs overcome the disadvantages faced in getting access to finance and support to grow their start-ups. Targeted support will be on a co-contribution basis. The Australian Government has announced a total of \$52.2 million in grant funding for this program. For Round 2, an estimated \$11.6 million in grant funding is available.

The objectives of the program are to:

- stimulate private sector investments into innovative start-ups led by women
- help women entrepreneurs overcome the disadvantages faced in getting access to finance and support to grow their start-ups
- enable female founders to scale-up, expand into domestic and global markets, and become self-sufficient
- boost the economy through increasing the diversity of start-up founders.

Estimated Grant Value (AUD): From \$25,000 to \$480,000 for female founded start-ups to expand into domestic and global markets.

FRRR Tackling Tough Times Together

The Tackling Tough Times Together (TTTT) program gives drought-affected communities across remote, rural and regional Australia the opportunity to access funds that benefit their immediate and long-term needs.



Grants are available for a broad range of grassroots, community-led initiatives that directly and clearly benefit local communities. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis and assessed quarterly.

What can be funded?

This program is designed to provide flexible funding to support community-based activities in drought-affected regions that both help to relieve current stressors and symptoms, and most importantly, build capacity and resilience for the future. Funds could also support activities that engage your local community in being proactive, exploring options and creating something that will stand the test of tough times.

This program funds a broad range of initiatives and purposes, including:

- Delivering activities, programs and services;
- Purchasing or hiring equipment and materials;
- Community infrastructure projects;
- Art, drama and creative expression projects to assist people to creatively express their experiences, which are otherwise limited due to the drought;
- Experiences for school children such as camps that connect young people and provide an opportunity to have fun with other young people off-farm.
- Operational and administrative costs associated with your project will be considered. This could include wages, paying a skilled contractor, or paying for overhead costs incurred in the project's delivery.

Neoen Hornsdale Wind Farm Energy Efficiency Fund

Neoen Energy seeks to make a positive contribution to the communities in which it operates. As a major employer and investor in the region Neoen Energy wishes to fulfil its responsibilities as a participant in the local community by establishing a fair and transparent Community Fund.

Neoen Energy has allocated an amount of \$60,000 (excl GST) in 2020/21 through its Energy Efficiency Fund for *not for profit, volunteer-based* community groups located within the **Northern Areas Council**. Caravan Park Defibrillator Subsidy

In 2019, the Federal Government in partnership with Caravan Industry Association of Australia, launched a Caravan Park Defibrillator Subsidy Program for Caravan Parks to encourage operators to install these devices to help save the lives of those people experiencing a sudden cardiac arrest. The funding of \$1 million from the government will match dollar to dollar up to \$1000 per unit (excluding GST) purchased by an operator.

Who is eligible and do I qualify?

Any commercial caravan park or accommodation provider that has caravan and camping style accommodation is eligible to apply for the subsidy. However, operators applying for the subsidy must adhere to several requirements as stipulated by the government:

- Caravan Parks with 40 sites or more, may access the subsidy for the purchase of up to two defibrillator units.
- Caravan Parks with less than 40 caravan park style sites may access the grant for the purchase of up to one defibrillator unit.
- Operators claiming the subsidy for a defibrillator must agree to the following terms on application:
- If requested, be able to demonstrate that their responsible staff have been or will be trained to use an defibrillator.
- Accept all responsibility for all liabilities in relation to the defibrillator, including their placement, security, upkeep and maintenance.
- Agree to fully indemnify the Commonwealth Government and Caravan Industry Association of Australia in relation to the subsidised defibrillators.
- Agree to the safe disposal of an expired defibrillator.
- A purchase receipt for the invoice must be provided.
- The defibrillator purchased must be on the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods List – your supplier can provide guidance regarding this. Caravan Industry Association of Australia is not able to provide guidance regarding suitable AED devices to purchase.

Caravan Industry Association of Australia will manage the implementation and the roll out of the **program beginning on 1st July 2019 until 30th June 2021.**

ON GOING GRANTS

Department for Infrastructure and Transport - Boat Launching Facilities

Boat owners who would like improvements made to the facilities they regularly use should approach their local council, which has the expertise to prepare a detailed funding assistance application.

An applicant applying for funding to assist with the construction of new boating facilities must commit to the on-going ownership and maintenance of the facility. Funding assistance is limited to 80% of the project cost, with the majority of projects only receiving 50% assistance.

Eligible Boating Projects are either the establishment of new or the upgrade of existing facilities and may include a boat ramp, a wharf or pontoons. A breakwater may also be funded if required as part of the project.

Key considerations are:

- All applicants must contribute funds to the project
- The completed project must be a public facility available to all recreational boaters
- The applicant must commit to the ongoing responsibility for the facility

Drought Community Support Initiative

The Australian Government Drought Community Support Initiative Round 2 provides financial assistance to farmers, farm workers, contractors and suppliers impacted by the drought.

The funding provides a one-off \$3000 cash payment to eligible households. Vinnies is assisting to distribute the funds. The payment is limited to one per household.



Payments can cover numerous expenses such as groceries, vehicle maintenance, energy & utility bills, health & medical expenses. The payment is not considered taxable income. If you had assistance in DCSI (Round 1) which concluded on 30 June 2019, you are eligible to apply for assistance for DCSI (Round 2).

**The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program**

The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program was announced in 2016 as part of the Australian Government's election commitment to improve access, educational opportunities and attainment for regional and remote Australians by supporting undergraduate, postgraduate and vocational education and training students from Certificate IV to PhD level.

Scholarships support flexible study arrangements, and are available to eligible students:

- commencing a new course of study in 2021
- studying on campus, online or via distance education
- studying from six months full-time up to eight years part-time
- Eligible students may receive up to \$18,000 each (e.g. for a full-time, four-year qualification). Shorter, part-time qualifications are paid on a pro rata basis. An extra \$500 is also available to support an internship.

Note: If you are a school leaver relocating from an outer regional or remote area to study, you may also be eligible for the Tertiary Access Payment.

Round 6 of the RRES program for students commencing study in 2022 will open in early 2022. More information on Round 6 will be available in late 2021.

Youngcare's Home Support Grants

The Youngcare Home Support Grants are available for individuals aged between 16 and 65 who have a physical disability and who need essential funding to either remain living at home or move back home from inappropriate housing such as Aged Care.

The Youngcare Home Support Grant provides up to \$10,000 (\$20,000 in extreme situations) for essential equipment, home modifications and services, and household items and utilities.



Youngcare's Home Support Grant can provide funding where there are critical gaps in an NDIS participant's plan, but there is still clear evidence of need. The grant also seeks to bridge the gap in essential services and support for families in need, during the transitional period while they gain access to the NDIS.

New App gives South Australian businesses support on the go

SA businesses now have access to on-the-spot financial support and services from the State Government thanks to a new mobile phone app launched on 27 January 2021.

The Retailer Energy Efficiency Scheme (REES)

A South Australian Government energy efficiency scheme that provides incentives for South Australian households and businesses to save energy. It does this through establishing energy efficiency and audit targets to be met by electricity and gas retailers.

South Australian households and businesses may be able to access discounted or free energy efficiency activities from energy retailers participating in the REES. Low-income households may also be able to receive an energy audit. The Minister has set the approved REES energy efficiency activities; however, each energy retailer participating in the scheme decides on what mix of those energy efficiency activities it will undertake to meet its targets.



To find out what activities energy retailers are currently offering, you can contact any of the obliged energy retailers in South Australia, not just the retailer currently supplying you. Energy retailers may contract out their energy audits and energy efficiency activities to third-party contractors, and you may also contact these third-party contractors directly.
